Financial Sponsorship Only

Platinum Level

Gold Level

\$500 or more in either cash or in-kind donations

Individual Level

\$499 or less in either cash or in-kind donations

Donations are tax-deductible to the extent permitted by law.

Partners are responsible for:

- Completing the web-based interest form
- Each volunteer must attend a partnership training session
- Designate a liaison to work with the leadership of the assigned school on the details of the partnership.
- Ensuring that each volunteer completes the required background check, whose cost must be covered by either the volunteer or the organization.

Pioneer Partnership Requirements

In-Kind- Contributions: To be determined in consultation with the school leadership team. Examples could include educational supplies, newspaper and magazine subscriptions or supplies for specialized programs, such as culinary, music, art, etc.

Leadership Exchange: Principal/CEO for a Day – The school principal and the organization's executive will shadow jobs for a day to exchange ideas and best practices.

Student Incentives: Offer incentives to improve student attendance, and academic performance including field trips, tickets to events, internships, book bags, supplies, etc.

Professional Development: Offer teachers and principals professional development opportunities with business employees. Provide funds needed to attend seminars.

Scholarships: Offer scholarships to qualified students to attend college, or other education experiences, such as seminars, competitions and conferences.

Speakers: Sponsor speakers (authors, community leaders, etc) to visit the school and engage with students.

Community Exposure: sponsor or chaperone field trips to cultural institutions, children's hospitals, markets, parks, and/or offer class tours of your company. Serve as guest speakers in the school.
